7 Public Participation Session

A member of public raised concerns regarding the Solar Farms and National Grid projects, he has seen 2 purchase order on the footpaths, one in Mill street and the other in Coldham Lane and is concerned about the proposed use of these footpaths.

Our village has been subject to flooding in recent years and has raised concerns if the proposed works go through land drainage it may increase risk of flooding. He is also concerned that 500-year oak trees are going to be removed as they are in the way of the proposed route.

He asked for this to be an agenda item at each meeting and asked what our MP is doing to help villages, DC Cllr Warboys said Richard Rout is working with SCC behind the scenes and have been taking legal advice.

CC J Fleming said it would be a good idea to keep a record of potential damage to environmental aspects of the village (habitats, trees

The Parish Council has not been made aware of the purchase orders and will investigate; 2 members of the council have joined the Ecopower community group and will give updates after the meeting in August.
